In his book Stalin's Slave Ships, Bollinger examined the evidence

and found that the Dzhurma did not enter service in the Dalstroï until 1935 and was not big enough to hold 12,000 prisoners. Bollinger estimated that the ship, if overcrowded, would be able to hold up to 6,500 prisoners.
